# THE HONEY BADGER

In 1952, a strong-willed young man called Ian spanning over three decades of Apartheid Player resigned from his factory job. He joined South Africa. a newly formed organisation called the Natal Parks Board, who later assigned him to the Umfolozi Game Reserve.

Then head of the Game Guard force at Umfolozi, was Magqubu Ntombela. A traditional Zulu man who carried the accumulated wisdom of his people, together with half-a-century's experience in the Zululand bush.

The two men could not then have known it, but this introduction was to mark the beginning of an extraordinary partnership

Their conservation initiatives in central Zululand (underpinned by ancient African wisdom) would provide a catalyst to South Africa's greatest conservation triumph, while shaping attitudes towards biodiversity across South Africa and the world.

Firstly, our histories are both alive. They are young and passionate. Diverse peoples from distant worlds reunited following Europe's expansion into the Atlantic. Our stories play out over vast tracts of land, which provided freedom and diluted the throttling class structures of European society.

Then came opportunity. Extraordinary pockets of it, and often with global implications. Cotton, diamonds, gold, and oil.

It all made for a potent recipe. A combination of freedom and opportunity, which would serve to unleash on our

human spirit: stories of violence and compromise; of prejudice and discrimination.

difference between good and evil, is

By implication (and despite all our apparent differences) the stories which forged the national identities, of South Africa and the United States, are far too human to be unique.

Indeed, in this story you'll discover a port at the southern tip of Africa, named Kaapstad by the Dutch and then Cape Town by the British, just as Manhattan was named Niewe Amsterdam and then New York by the same peoples.

In our discovery of diamonds and gold, you will find yourself pinching the seeds of tobacco and cotton.

In our scramble for scarce labour, you will peer into a mirror reflecting your own stories of slavery and segregation.

Calling out from South Africa's wars for

freedom from an oppressive colonial power, you'll hear the battle cries at Lexington and Concord.

And in the mighty struggle of a people seeking racial justice, you'll hear the whisper of Jefferson's observing that all men are created equal.

In Shaka and Paul Kruger, in Rhodes and Mandela and you will discover elements of Lincoln and Sitting Bull; of Roosevelt, Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King.

This story aims to take American audiences beyond a lecture on South African history.

It offers instead an emotional attachment to the people of South Africa. An opportunity to forge a bond with a land so complex, very few people truly connect.

I believe you can.

And in the process, you may just discover some perspective on your own country, just as the remarkable story of the United States helped me to untangle the complexities of South Africa's past.

# A STORY OF AN EXTRAORDINARY SPRINGBOK TOUR TO NEW ZEALAND



Through an unlikely sequence of events the first two series between the Springboks and the All Blacks (in 1921 and 1928) had been tied. And considering the ongoing global dominance of both teams, there was near unanimous recognition by 1937, that this was to be a world championship bout.

Predictably then, the tour captured the imagination of New Zealand, where rugby had transcended the chalk lines to emerge as a function of their national identity.

By implication rugby tours to New Zealand are the toughest test in all of rugby: the challenge put to Philp Nel his 1937 Springboks.

It was to emerge as a wonderfully human story, involving a motley crew of farmers, students, bankers and teachers. For in being freed from the throttling political narrative in South Africa, they were allowed to express themselves both as rugby players and as human beings.

They did so famously, and in the process they captured the imagination of a generation of New Zealanders.

A celebration of the chivalry associated with the amateur era and a powerful reminder – through an emotional sense of nostalgia – what is truly important in life and legacy.

When Bill Maclagan captained the first British touring team out to South Africa in 1891, the public were mesmerised by their handling skills. The bladder, they observed, was shifted from side to side like lightening. It was an exhibition as opposed to a contest, as the British conceded just a single try in 21 games.

But the South Africans would be quick to learn, But plenty hasn't. and very soon it was the tourists who were struggling to win a series in South Africa.

MUD, MINES & MELODY is a short story developed as a curtain-raiser for Wales, South Africa test matches.

The story briefly explores Welsh history in order to provide context around their famous colours and symbols, together with the origins of their famous tradition for singing.

Most notably, it identifies similarities in our modern histories, both of which came to be dominated by massive mining industries.

For those mines were to provide the basis for a deeply divided societies, but also a love of rugby which was to emerge as the emotional pastime of both countries.

On the field, Wales was the original rugby giant. South Africa, the contender. And yet, through a bizarre sequence of events, the Springboks (often in diabolical weather) managed to hold off the mighty Welsh for nearly a century.

In that time, as John Billot observed, "the only thing the Springboks lost were the toss, ... and Boy Louw's teeth in the mud at Swansea."

But with the opening of the Millennium Stadium in 1999, a famous victory established a new era in the rivalry.

This is a story about the rise of Wales as a rugby giant, and the Springbok habit of taming them – very often against all odds.
